

REP. BOHAC SHARES NEWS FROM LEGISLATURE

State Representative Dwayne Bohac was the featured speaker at SBOCA's Annual Meeting on October 20, 2015. His remarks centered on the recently completed legislative session for the state of Texas.

"What does the state do?"

The Texas Legislature meets bi-annually for 5 months; during the off months, the members return home to their regular jobs. The House and Senate alternate in proposing the state's budget. This year's budget was for \$210 billion. Of that, 60% comes from sales tax.

Bills passed this session include

- Property and business tax relief.
- Border security (purchase of vehicles and establishment of a task force with DPS).
- Transportation (designating part of the sales tax reve-

nue for road construction).

- Education (calling for high quality pre-kindergarten classes, and changing school accountability to give individual schools an A-F rating and 2-year "fix it" window.
- Allowing individuals with an open-carry license to wear holsters in view.
- Pastor protection for those who do not wish to perform same-sex marriages.

ADDITIONAL STREETS PETITION FOR MLSB

Additional streets in Spring Branch Oaks are still being approved by the City of Houston Planning Department for a Minimum Lot Size Block designation.

Petitions signed by residents are pending or have already been approved by the City Council for the following streets: Leto, Livernois, Spring Branch, Walterville, and Willowview. Petitions for Saddle and Spur were accepted in late December. This designation prevents a lot on those streets from being subdivided into lots with an area less than that of 70% of the currents lots. If you are interested in beginning the application process for your street, help is available from the city and from SBOCA neighbors who have already been through the process.
