The Annual Meeting and last General Meeting for 2013 will be held on Tuesday, October 15, in Latham Hall, at the rear of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, 1656 Blalock. There will be a light supper at 6:30 p.m., and the business meeting will begin at 7:00.

Meet the candidates

Candidates for City Council Representative, District A, in the upcoming city election are being invited to attend. Do you know who they are? There is a large field of candidates in this race, so it will be helpful for residents to meet them and hear what they have to say before election day on Tuesday, November 5.

Board Member to be elected This is also the meeting where an Executive Board member for the coming year will be elected. No Nominating Committee is in place, so nominations will be taken from the floor. Any member of the Association may be nominated or place a name in nomination.

There will be only one position to fill this year. Current president Sheree Speck will complete her term and rotate off. The remaining four members have either one or two additional years to serve. The new member will be elected for a three-year term.

Under the current by-laws, board members are not elected for a specific office. At its first meeting in 2014, the new Executive Board will determine which member will serve in each office.

Do something!

SBOCA residents frequently contact association president Sheree Speck asking that the Association "Do something about..." an issue in their neighborhood. It may be some safety issue or an annoyance such as barking dogs, unsightly yard, loud music....

Unfortunately, many of these complaints are outside the bounds of the Association's authority. This topic will be addressed briefly at the October General Meeting and discussed in more detail at the January meeting. When the problem <u>is</u> a violation of the deed restrictions or guidelines (*Copies of these are available in the 2012 directory and on the Association's website.*), **the best first step is**

often to speak directly to the neighbor or owner of the property yourself. Perhaps they aren't aware of the restriction or the annoyance.

If that doesn't help, the next step should be to contact Jim Beuchele, who is chairman of the Deed Restriction Oversight Committee (DROCOM). This group is the "official" representative for the Association is such matters and is made up of volunteers who are giving their time and effort to help protect our subdivision. In the past few years, participation in DROCOM has dwindled. The Executive Board is again looking at employing a property management firm to handle these situations. Unfortunately, such a step would likely require a raise in the annual assessment fee. Please consider how you can be directly involved as a member of DROCOM and plan to attend the General Meeting on Tuesday, October 15, to give your input.
