ANNUAL ASSESSMENT, MANAGEMENT OPTIONS WILL BE TOPICS FOR JANUARY 21 MEETING

SBOCA Annual Assessment has remained the same (\$20) for many years, in spite of inflation and rising costs to the association. It is time to consider raising this fee, in order to properly fund some needed services.

The task of the treasurer has also become more complicated. The Board of Directors has been investigating options to make our association more efficient and responsive to the needs of the neighborhood. One of these options is employing a management company to assist with some of the treasurer's duties.

These two issues will be a topic of discussion at the first General Membership Meeting of the year, being held on Tuesday, January 21, 2014, at Latham Hall in the rear of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, 1656 Blalock Road.

The meeting will begin with a light supper at 6:30 p.m., followed by the business meeting at 7:00 p.m.

Our application for Minimum Lot Size designation has been accepted by the city Planning Department, and we will have a report of the status of that application at the meeting.

New policies related to payment of the Annual Assessment are now in place, with particular application to late payments. Treasurer Linda Lochli will explain the new procedure.

Please come to be part of the discussion and to vote on any business which comes before the membership. There is growing interest in the Spring Branch area, and we want our neighborhood to be attractive and remain a pleasant place to live. That requires the participation of every homeowner!

STREET REPAIRS GAIN CITY APPROVAL

The following information comes from City Councilwoman Helena Brown's year-end newsletter:

With the passage of the drainage fee, the City implemented the "ReBuild Houston" process for advancing street and drainage, and water and sewage infrastructure needs, or Capital Improvement Plans (CIPs) in the City of Houston. However, the new system excluded Council Member input as they went to "highest need" based of a computerized model.

With Council support, the Executive Director of "ReBuild Houston" agreed to receive from each Council Member just one recommendation for a district CIP for his consideration for inclusion. The District A office submitted not one, but six, CIPs needed in the district. The following two were approved for pre-engineering in 2014.

 HIGHEST PRIORITY ITEM: The highest priority is the Bunker Hill area north of I-10. This area has sustained considerable flooding damage in the past.... The boundaries for this section of priority are the following: Bunker Hill Road between Long Point and I-10; east to Blalock and west to Gessner. Drainage Improvements would also be included in this project.

2. Long Point Reconstruction
Project: Reconstruction of Long
Point between the already completed
intersections of Wirt and Blalock. Also
reconstructions of the Bingle, Silber,
Antoine, and Gessner intersections, and
both North and South Campbell Road
intersections, and the roadway between
these intersections.

Both these projects are "close to home" for Spring Branch Oaks residents and will cause traffic disruption when they are begun, but they will improve the appearance of the area and have a beneficial effect in the long run.
